## Critique is not a Dirty Word

Developing and using an observational vocabulary for deeply looking at, analyzing, and evaluating artwork of one's own and others' is essential to the development of each artist. Curator of Art Lugene Bruno and Assistant Curator of Art Carrie Roy, Hunt Institute, will teamteach a one-day workshop that will introduce a vocabulary for critical analysis while leading a group discussion of class member's artwork as well as images of work by leading botanical and non-botanical artists. A hand-out of terminology will be provided and these terms will be incorporated into the group conversations to assist the participants in becoming comfortable and more confident with their use. Remember, all artwork is the product of choices made by the artist and no matter how accomplished that artist is, no one person's artwork will ever be perfect. Participants will leave this workshop feeling more confident in their ability to see, discuss, and evaluate those choices and incorporate those lessons into their future work.

## Supply List

Each participant should bring 3 originals or high-quality reproductions (1 may be at any stage of completion). If desired, one may bring a supporting sketch per artwork if there is a question about a specific problem area in the artwork.
