Reds: Quinacridone Red, Scarlet Lake, Alizarin Crimson,

Blues: French Aquamarine Blue, Prussian Blue

Earth Tones: Burnt Sienna

Shadow Color: Neutral Tint

Brushes: I usually recommend Windsor Newton Series 7 Miniature Brushes Sizes 2 and 3

- Kneaded eraser
- Magnifying lens
- Brush for mixing paint
- · Large brush or draftsman mini duster to brush erasures
