Spend a day playing with a variety of colored pencil techniques while exploring the vibrant colors of the changing autumn leaves. We will experiment with creating interesting, rich color, try out different surfaces, and learn various ways to use under-painting to enhance our work.



Supply List

- I will provide drawing paper. If you have paper you prefer bring a couple of sheets. You may
 also work in your preferred sketch pad as long as it can take a little water. The Stillman & Birn
 Zeta Series Sketchbook is a nice choice for experimenting with different media.
- Kneaded eraser. Also Recommended -the Tombow Mono Round eraser for graphite drawing.
- Graphite drawing pencil, H or HB and a small inexpensive clear ruler.
- Pencil sharpener
- Waterbrush or travel watercolor brush nothing fancy to try out watercolor pencil which I will provide.
- Our classroom does not have individual student lamps so you may want to bring a battery operated Ottlite type lamp.
- Colored Pencils

Bring good quality colored pencils that you like to work with . I will have some to share. Bring a limited palette of your favorite pencils. We will do color mixing and experimenting so you do not need to carry a lot of pencils. I have lots of extras.

This is a suggested basic palette that fits nicely in t o a small tin for travel.
