Range of sharp pencils Staedtler Plastic Eraser Kneadable eraser Tombo Mono zero eraser Emery board or sandpaper

Bring your normal brush selection, I use Isabey Series 6227Z - 6 and 4

Whatever you bring, please include two of each size

Any miniature brushes you might own

Any small lifting brushes – could be labeled brights, shaders –look for small synthetic square ended flat brushes.
